2024 brought many firsts for our organization. The first Des Moines Annual Hunger Fight held in our West Des Moines facility, the first time participating in the 9/11 Day of Service events in Detroit & Cincinnati, and the first time packaging meals at the Illinois State FFA convention. These events were all successfully executed by our awesome team (along with 156 other private events and over 400 open pack events in our packaging center!) allowing us to package over 19 million meals in 2024! Our full time staff of 12 can't do this on our own. So thank you to the individuals, companies, churches, schools, and communities for your generous donations allowing us to purchase the product needed to produce these meals. In addition, thank you to the over 60,000 volunteers who gave of their time packaging meals, washing dishes, labeling bags or serving on our board - just to name a few of our many volunteer opportunities. ### WHERE DID MEALS GO IN 2024?

Meals from the Heartland supports school feeding programs across the globe, with millions of meals sent to countries experiencing the greatest need: South Africa, Zambia, Madagascar, Haiti, Senegal, the Philippines, Eswatini, Togo, Liberia, Chad, Congo, Niger, Ukraine and Burkina Faso.



In response to the crisis in Ukraine, Meals from the Heartland provided 855,360 meals, offering hope and nourishment during this challenging time.





Joseph, a sixth-grader in Zambia, often wished he could grow up faster to help his mom, who struggled to provide for her family. Some days, he went to school without food because his mom couldn't afford both rent and meals for her children.

In Zambia, **35**% of children suffer from stunted growth due to poverty and malnutrition.

Thanks to Meals from the Heartland, Joseph can focus on his studies and play with his friends, no longer worrying about where his next meal will come from. "We know at school we are going to find food, we are going to eat, and we are going to be healthy and satisfied. I'm very energetic. I get to think properly when I'm doing class work. It becomes easier because of the food program, and I even get to play." Joseph said.

### **Cedar Rapids Hunger Fight**

Our 7th Annual Cedar Rapids Hunger Fight took place on June 5 and 6, where 520 dedicated volunteers came together to package 225,072 Taco Mac meals. These meals were distributed by Hawkeye Area Community Action Program, Inc. (HACAP) to support hungry children and families across Iowa.

### **Quad Cities Hunger Fight**

With the support of generous sponsors and volunteers, we were able to provide meals to Riverbend Food Bank to feed 203 children for an entire year. 774 volunteers in WDM, DSM, and Omaha collectively packaged meals in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on Monday, January 20 during the Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service. 305,000 Taco Mac meals were packaged and distributed to local food pantries to feed hungry families in Des Moines and Omaha. As part of a nationwide initiative, our staff traveled to Cincinnati and Detroit to join 25,000 volunteers in 21 cities for 911day.org's Annual Day of Service. In Detroit & Cincinnati alone, we packaged 422,000 meals for local food banks, providing vital support to these communities and spreading hope on this meaningful day of remembrance.



### **Hurricane Relief**
